The Risen King on the Emmaus Road

This Week's Main Passages:

Luke 24:13-35

This Week's Lesson:

1. The risen King is with us in our sorrow and confusion: Read Luke 24:13-24 / Jesus asked two seemingly flippant, almost humorous questions—What’cha talkin’ about? What things?—which together led the men to explain two things: what they knew about about Jesus, and what had just happened to Him.
2. The risen King is the focus of all the Scriptures: Read Luke 24:25-27 / Jesus took the opportunity to connect those two things by citing the Scriptures’ prophecies.
3. The risen King makes Himself known to His people: Read Luke 24:28-35 / We learn several interesting things about Jesus in this overall passage. First, in His resurrection body, He was not recognized. (Why?) Second, in His resurrection body, He was able to “vanish from their sight.” (Was this different from before?) Finally, it appears that Jesus engineered this meeting for the purpose of providing the disciples with another affirmation of His resurrection. (Why did they need it?)

Review from last week

- Come and see the empty tomb (Matt 28:1-6)
- Stop and worship the risen Lord (Matt 28:7-9)
- Go and tell others the truth about Jesus (28:10-15)

What we're skipping since last week

The women find the disciples and tell them of the empty tomb and of seeing Jesus. The disciples initially do not believe them, considering their words nonsense (Luke 24:11), but Peter (and John) run to the tomb and see only the linen wrappings.
